PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Sisters & Brothers in the Lord!

The Second Sunday of Easter is known as the "Divine Mercy Sunday". Today our liturgy honors the merciful love of God. John's Gospel explains in 3:16 "God so loved the World that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not be lost, but may have Eternal Life. God sent His Son into the World, not to condemn it, but to save it through Him". This is the gratuitous gift of God, freely given to all believers.

Divine Mercy Devotion was popularized by Saint Faustina Kowalska (1905 - 1938) a 33 old Consecrated Nun. Paul in 2 Cor 5:19 explained, "God in Christ was reconciling the World to himself, forgiving our failure by the Blood of Christ on the Cross". Jesus gave a visible expression to the merciful love of God. Paul again in Rom 7:1 argued, 'Jesus was without sin, but God made him to die for us by allowing him to be born in a human family, to experience human weakness, and also to undergo the most excruciating & painful death on the Cross for the salvation of humans.

The Justice of God is the Mercy of God. The purpose of Redemption is the Mercy of God. It is a Divine attribute, which is his redemptive justice, which makes humans just / right with God. Rom 3:3:21-22 tells, "in Union with Christ, we are made right with God & we become a New Creation, and (2 Cor 5:17-21) We are radically changed because of Christ's death and resurrection which transforms our life.

Sister Faustina had talked about the Three Ideals of Divine Mercy. 1) To ask for the Mercy of God and obtain it through Prayer. 2) To Trust in God's Mercy. 3) To show Mercy to others. There are about 100 million people who follow the ideal of Divine Mercy From page 1...

around the World. St. John Paul II dedicated a shrine for Divine Mercy and said, apart from the mercy of God, there is no source of hope for humankind. Through the devotion of Divine Mercy, we come to know the face of God and better relate it to our ordinary life.

"The quality of mercy is not strained. It drops as a gentle rain from heaven. It blesses those who give and those who receive" wrote Shakespeare. Mt 5:7 puts the same idea in the beatitude "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy". Pope Francis advises that 'Mercy is the tenderness of God' and when we engage in the Corporal and Spiritual works, we spread the fragrance of the Mercy of God around.



## Mass for the Unborn




Now that we can gather again, we would like to meet after the 8:30 am Mass on Sunday June 5th for coffee and cake to honour the life and work of Sister Nancy who has given so freely of her time and talents. Here are a few more quotes from Pope Francis' meeting with the Indigenous delegations from Canada.

"...Let me start from a saying that is part of your traditional wisdom. It is not only a turn of phrase but also a way of viewing life: 'In every deliberation, we must consider the impact on the seventh generation.' These are wise words, farsighted and the exact opposite of what often happens in our own day, when we run after practical and immediate goals without thinking of the future generations yet to come..."


"...I would like to speak of some of those fruits, which deserve to be better known and appreciated.

First, your care for the land, which you see not as a resource to be exploited, but as a gift of heaven. For you, the land preserves the memory of your ancestors who rest there: it is a vital setting making it possible to see each individual's life as part of a greater web of relationships with the Creator, with the human community, with all living species and with the earth, our common home...The chain that passed on knowledge and ways of life in union with the land was broken by a colonization that lacked respect for you, tore many of you from your vital milieu and tried to conform you to another mentality..."

"...Listening to your voices, I was able to enter into and be deeply grieved by the stories of the suffering, hardship, discrimination and various forms of abuse that some of you experienced, particularly in the residential schools. It is chilling to think of determined efforts to instil a sense of inferiority, to rob people of their cultural identity, to sever their roots, and to consider all the personal and social effects that this continues to entail: unresolved traumas that have become intergenerational traumas."
