PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Brothers & Sisters in the Lord!

This week's Gospel Lk 13: 6-9 is so very timely and thought provoking because it helps us 'develop an attitude of deep gratitude' for what God has accomplished in our lives. "We have bloomed where we are planted". The metaphor of the 'fig tree' symbolizes the prosperity, wellbeing and security that we have in our land and family. This metaphor was originally used for the Land of Israel to explain its Physical and Spiritual Health. (Hosea 9:10) "It was like finding grapes in the wilderness when I found Israel, like seeing early fruit on the fig tree". 1 Kgs 4:25 "Judah & Israel lived in security, each under his vine and fig tree". Israel is full of fig trees. Fig is the edible fruit from the Mediterranean & western Asia. They produce Two harvests.

Figs are an excellent source of dietary fiber. It also offers Cardiovascular benefits. It contains essential minerals & antioxidants. 2 Kgs 20:7 & Is 38:5 explain how Hezehiah, the King of Judah, who had a 'lump' was amazingly cured by the application of the fig paste. "I have heard your prayers and seen your tears. I will cure you and add 15 years to your life".

'Fig Tree' has become the emblem of the Judean Nation as our 'Maple leaf' in Canada. Fig tree is an ornamental plant. The thick and dense leaves on the fig tree are a sign that the fruit is ripe and ready to eat. This particular tree looked as if it would be full of figs. That was what Jesus expected. But he only found leaves and no fruit. So, he was disappointed and told the gardener, "Cut it down, why should it be wasting the soil?".

God was specific in His instruction to the Israelites to follow His ways & be faithful to Him delighting in His Presence. It was the path that would lead to produce good fruits in their lives. But they failed and became fruitless and barren. Fruitlessness or barrenness is a serious condition in our moral and religious life /character and we become like a show of the barren fig tree of the gospel.

God wishes that, 'We Bloom & Produce Good Fruits' wherever we are planted. Our Union with Him should help us produce good 'spiritual fruits' (Gal 5:22-23) and not give the mere appearance of religiosity alone. (pious but unproductive, leads to duplicating ourselves, living in false hope so to say) Therefore Luke 13:5 Cautions us 'to repent' so that we could have a turning point in our life for the better. To repent is to change one's mind. It's a conscious decision to give up our wicked ways 'turning away from our weakness and turning towards God for His blessings!

God will purge our sins. Leviticus 16:30 tells us that the 'rite of atonement will purify and we will be clean to stand before God'. God through his purifying grace will cleanse and regenerate us through His Spirit. Jesus said, by their fruits you shall know them (Mt 7:20) The fruit of repentance offers us to reestablish our relationship with God and become Godly People. Let us also remember that like the fruit laden fig tree, our life also will be Blooming with God's Grace.
