PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord!

"No one is outside of the Mercy of God" reminds Pope Francis. No one should be a lost brother, lost sheep, lost coin and the lost Son/ Child. Everyone should have their rightful place in God's life. (We are heirs and co-heirs with Christ in glory) God's love is expressed in His Forgiveness. God cannot but forgive. God's mercy for sinners and those who require his healing touch & embrace, breaks through all human restrictions. God's mercy indeed is as foolish as the shepherd who abandons the 99 sheep to save the lost one or like the woman who turns her house upside down to recover her lost penny or like the Jewish Father who joyfully welcomes home his scoundrel son who has squandered his property. We believers have such a merciful Father God, who would be able to accept and welcome despite our obstinacy.

When hearts are heavily burdened with worries, stress, suffering, anxiety or crushed by life's challenges people feel broken. Hearts are broken through desertion, neglect (children running away from home) or when love becomes cold (betrayal of friends or lovers/spouses) or when we feel the ingratitude of people with indifference and apathy. Hearts are broken when an infant/child dies suddenly or loses a loved one by untimely death as we experience in Ukraine these days both the civilians and the uniformed personnel's death or death of a relationship. Hearts are broken when we pass through defeat, disappointment and failure in life.

The normal human response to brokenness is 'weeping or seclusion'. Tears automatically swell up because of the crushing experiences of life. 'Tears are the language of the soul', explains Psalm 34:6, & 18 "A cry goes up from the poor man, and God hears and helps from all troubles & the eyes of God are turned towards the broken hearted & helps those whose spirit is crushed". Our Christian response to brokenness should be that we should be able to 'seek the face of the Lord' in prayer. We unite our pain with the pain of Christ who suffered for us on the Cross. Suffering comes to all of us in all sizes and shapes in our everyday life. When we try to bury them deep down in our hearts, they boil, simmer and stew inside and in the long run come to the forefront snatching away our peace, faith and health and sometimes contribute to a deeper layer of brokenness.

As people of faith, we need to take control of ourselves and take the painful situation to the Lord for His Healing and Comfort. Our grief & lament cleanses and purifies and transforms us in the presence of God. Henry Newman tells us that 'brokenness moulds and shapes our character and gives us maturity of mind'. Our brokenness helps us to surrender to God for help and healing. God's response to our human brokenness is that, 'He gives grace to surrender and before Him we appear like a broken pot with a broken life and with our broken promises'. We reflect in His Divine Presence, "What is life, but a pot of broken dreams and promises'.

This Sunday extends an invitation to think about our 'Spiritual brokenness' especially our emptiness and wasted opportunities. Where did we squander and distance ourselves like the Prodigal Son? The Bible tells us that he came to his senses and returned to his dad, who welcomed him unconditionally. If we follow His example of returning to God, God Our father would be able to welcome, restore and make us whole again. Shall we develop courage to return to Him with a willing heart & mind?
